

Community

In School Programming

Socio-emotional and therapeutic programs in schools in Raton and Taos that offer students skills and relationship-building support to protect against victimization, suicide, and delinquency and become healthier, happier adults.

Branches: Outdoor Adventure

Monthly outdoor activities for kids in Taos to build confidence and encourage positive risk taking.

Summer of Play

Out-of-school activities for families in income-based housing in Taos County.

Trauma Trainings

Training on the impact of trauma on child development for staff and educators in local child-serving organizations and schools.

Court

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA)

CASA volunteers advocate on behalf of and in the best interest of foster children as they navigate the court system.

CASA volunteers are trained and supported by Youth Heartline staff and play an essential role in a foster child's life.

Safe Exchange & Supervised Visitation (SESV)

SESV offers a safe place for the children of separated parents to bond with the non-custodial parent in a playroom designed to encourage positive parentchild interactions



Case management, life skills support, and housing for youth ages 16-24 who are experiencing homelessness in Raton.












Our Stories


Four young boys successfully camped out overnight for the first time in their lives - learning to put up a tent, cook on an open fire, and how fast weather can change in the mountains.

A father had not seen his 11-year old son in a year entered our Supervised Visitation program. During his visits, he taught his son to watercolor as they shared stories of each other's lives. After time in our program, the father now has unsupervised visits with his son.

Our Family Navigator (FN) assisted a mother with two children who had been living in a shed for years get into the local family hotel program during the cold winter months. The FN helped the mother apply for a rapid rehousing voucher through DreamTree which she was awarded. The FN then worked with a local landlord to locate and reserve a home for her while it was being worked on. The family successfully moved into their new home and is thriving.
